TRADITIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL	<ul> <li>✓ Free public schools based on your physical address or zone</li> <li>✓ May charge tuition for open enrollment transfers</li> <li>✓ Public school districts must have a policy allowing students to apply for open enrollment within the same school district</li> <li>✓ Public school districts get to decide if they accept transfers between school districts</li> </ul>
PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL	<ul> <li>✓ Free public schools</li> <li>✓ Must take any student who applies if there is a seat available - including students with disabilities</li> <li>✓ Schools have fixed application deadlines</li> <li>✓ If applications exceed available seats, a lottery is held</li> </ul>
PUBLIC MAGNET SCHOOL	<ul> <li>✓ Free public schools</li> <li>✓ May have entrance exams or performance auditions</li> <li>✓ Schools have fixed application deadlines</li> </ul>
PRIVATE SCHOOL	✓ Scholarships funded by donors who receive tax credits are available for all students statewide ✓ State-funded tuition vouchers are also available for students statewide with specific programs targeted by area and student needs ✓ Money families spend on private schooling counts toward the taxes they owe
ONLINE	✓ More than 9 free, full-time online "e-schools"  ✓ Some public school districts have blended or completely online options
HOMESCHOOL & MICROSCHOOL	<ul> <li>✓ Independent, parent-driven education</li> <li>✓ Funding is available through a tax-credit and a scholarship for students with an IEP</li> <li>✓ Must provide notice of intent to homeschool</li> <li>✓ Specific subjects must be taught</li> <li>✓ Homeschooled students may still be eligible to participate in sports or classes free of charge</li> <li>✓ Microschools - students gathered in small groups to learn are available</li> </ul>
