<ul> <li>✓ Free public schools based on your physical address or zone</li> <li>✓ Unrestricted open enrollment - can send your child to any public school in the state</li> <li>✓ Public school districts cannot charge tuition for transfers</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>✓ Free public schools</li> <li>✓ Must take any student who applies if there is a seat available - including students with disabilities</li> <li>✓ Schools have fixed application deadlines</li> <li>✓ If applications exceed available seats, a lottery is held</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>✓ Free public schools</li> <li>✓ May have entrance exams or performance auditions</li> <li>✓ Schools have fixed application deadlines</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>✓ State-funded accounts that can pay for tuition and other expenses are universally available</li> <li>✓ Scholarships funded by donors who receive tax credits and funded by the state are available for students with disabilities</li> <li>✓ Other scholarship options may be available from schools or nonprofits</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>✓ Free, full-time online programs are available</li> <li>✓ Private, tuition-based online options are available</li> <li>✓ Some public school districts have their own online programs</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>✓ Independent, parent-driven education</li> <li>✓ Funding may be available through an education scholarship account</li> <li>✓ Notarized homeschool affidavit is required prior to homeschooling</li> <li>✓ No specific subjects must be taught</li> <li>✓ No standardized assessments are required</li> <li>✓ Students may still be eligible to participate in sports, activities, or classes at local public schools</li> <li>✓ Microschools - students gathered in small groups to learn are available</li> </ul>
